As members grow in ability and knowledge they move up into the next band.  The band held public concerts in May, June, September and December. Individual bands performed at Martlesham Village Fete, Ipswich Music Day, Brass on the Grass in Christchurch Park, Ipswich, a Coronation event at Rushmere, a concert in St Andrews Church, Melton, Suffolk Remembers, part of Suffolk Day and with Ipswich Choral Society at Ipswich Corn Exchange.  The band also provides bands for Remembrance parades in Martlesham and Woodbridge.  In December band members play carols in various locations including in The Square, Martlesham Heath collecting funds to be divided between three charities nominated by band members. The highlight of the year was a workshop and concert with the renowned tuba player Les Neish. Les has created a career as a soloist, chamber musician and educator with a world-wide reputation. Known for his musicianship, artistry and high level of communication, Les dazzled audience and members with fabulous technique and stunning musicianship.
